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REPORT-1

Analysis of Feedback Received From Various Stakeholders

Teacher trainees and faculty members of the college initiated the practice of obtaining feedback to meet the needs and requirements of schools, from faculty members, teacher trainees, school heads/teachers regarding different aspects of teacher training imparted by the college. Feedback from various stakeholders as mentioned below are collected annually through IQAC and the data was analyzed and discussed for further improvement.

- 1. Teachers evaluation by students of B.Ed. and M.Ed. courses on five points rating scale. This feedback proforma consists of following ten aspects:
- 1. Communication skills
- 2. Interest generated by teacher
- 3. Ability to integrate course material with environment/other issue/other subjects
- 4. Impartial and equal dealing with all the students
- 5. Accessibility of the teacher in and out of class
- 6. Ability to design quizzes/examination/assignments to test understanding of the course.
- 7. Sufficient timely feedback on students' assignments/projects/tests
- 8. Knowledge base of the teacher
- 9. Sincerity/ commitment of the teacher
- 10. Punctuality
- 2. Feedback from students of B.Ed. and M.Ed. courses regarding their campus experience was obtained through a proforma entitled 'Overall Appraisal of the College'. It is a five points rating scale consisting of following aspects of college functioning:

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- 1. Academic Environment of the college
- 2. Usefulness of TLM available in the college
- 3. Fairness in Evaluation
- 4. Quality of feedback given by teachers
- 5. Opportunity for Interaction with teachers
- 6. Teaching/Training methodology used by teachers
- 7. Pre-preparation for theory class by teachers
- 8. Dealing of principal and administrative staff with the students
- 9. Sufficiency of Infrastructure
- 10. Opportunities for using the different laboratories
- 11. Opportunities fororganizing and participating in co-curricular activities.
- 12. Opportunities forIntellectual enrichment
- 13 Timely coverage of Course/Syllabus by the teachers
- 14. Computer Facilities
- 15. Availability and access of relevant course books in library
- 16. Overall Rating of the college.

In addition to this suggestions were also received in the same proforma from the students for improving college functioning in future.

- 3. Rating of the resource person by B.Ed. and M.Ed. students on five points rating scale with following criteria:
- 1. Communication skills of resource persons
- 2. Interest generated by the resource person
- 3. Relevancy of the topic
- 4. Opportunity for interaction with resource person

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- 5. Mastery of resource person in the concerned topic/field.
- 4. Feedback is also obtained from school heads/teachers regarding practice teaching on five points rating scale having following aspects:
- 1. Quality of teaching aids used by the pupil teachers
- 2. Coverage of syllabus by the pupil teachers
- 3. Activities carried by pupil teachers during teaching practice
- 4. Discipline maintained by pupil teachers
- 5. Regularity and punctuality of pupil teachers
- 6. Assigning of home work by pupil teachers
- 7. Regular checking and correction of home work by pupil teachers
- 8. Co-ordination with school staff.

In addition to these aspects of practice teaching major weaknesses and suggestions were also obtained.

Apart from this feedback from teacher educators regarding practice teaching, Self-Appraisal of teaching and non teaching staff were also collected and analyzed.

BEST PRACTICES

Title of the Best Practice No.-1:

"Environmental Awareness through Cleanliness drive."

One of the most glaring problems which the world faces today is the environmental pollution. Man has exploited nature excessively at the cost of the environment.
